**ORBIT INTERNATIONAL RECEIVES ORDER FOR
U.S. COAST GUARD MK 119 GUN COMPUTER SYSTEM CABINET VALUED IN
EXCESS OF \$425,000**

ANTICIPATED FOLLOW-ON ORDERS IN EXCESS OF \$1,700,000

Hauppauge, New York, March 27, 2008 -- Orbit International Corp. (NASDAQ:ORBT), an electronics manufacturer, systems integrator and software solution provider, today announced that its Electronics Group has received an order placed against its multi-year Indefinite Delivery/Indefinite Quantity ("IDIQ") contract for MK 119 Gun Computer System Cabinets (GCSC) from a U.S. Navy Procurement Agency for the Coast Guard Deepwater Program valued at approximately \$425,000. This award was received by the Company's newly acquired Integrated Combat Systems, Inc. ("ICS") subsidiary located in Louisville, Kentucky. Deliveries under this contract are scheduled for the fourth quarter of 2008. Total anticipated follow-on orders for the Coast Guard Deepwater Program are in excess of \$1,700,000 and are expected each year through 2011.

The MK 119 GCSC is an unmanned, environmentally-isolated shipboard enclosure that houses a standard 19 inch electronics rack containing processors, electronic devices, cooling and power conditioning equipment that performs processing, interfacing and data extraction functions designed to meet the most stringent U.S. Navy operational systems requirements. The MK 119 GCSC is also used on AEGIS Cruisers and Destroyers, and are operationally integrated within the 5"/54 MK-45 Gun Mount (GM) systems.

Ken Ice, President and Chief Operating Officer of ICS, commented, "The Coast Guard's Integrated Deepwater System is a critical multi-year program, designated and funded to modernize and replace the Coast Guard's aging ships and aircraft and improve command and control and logistics systems. ICS continues to provide an integral part of this modernization program. The capabilities provided by the Deepwater Program enable the Coast Guard to perform more effectively, providing increased readiness and enhanced mission performance."
